A BILL

To require the Secretary of Agriculture to initiate hearings to review Federal milk marketing orders relating to pricing of Class I skim milk, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Dairy Pricing Oppor-
- 5 tunity Act of 2023".
- 6 SEC. 2. NOTICE AND HEARINGS.
- 7 (a) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 180 days after the
- 8 date of enactment of this Act, the Secretary of Agriculture

shall provide notice of, and initiate, national hearings to 2 review Federal milk marketing orders under section 8c(3) 3 of the Agricultural Adjustment Act (7 U.S.C. 608c(3)), 4 reenacted with amendments by the Agricultural Marketing 5 Agreement Act of 1937, which shall include review and consideration of views and proposals of producers and the 6 dairy industry on the Class I skim milk price, including 8 the "higher of" Class I skim milk formula described in subsection (b) and any other views and proposals on the 10 Class I skim milk price, and such other matters as the Secretary of Agriculture considers appropriate. 12 (b) "Higher of" Class I Skim Milk Formula Described.—The "higher of" Class I skim milk formula referred to in subsection (a) is the formula under which, 14 15 for purposes of determining prices for milk of the highest use classification, the Class I skim milk price per hundred-16 weight specified in section 1000.50(b) of title 7, Code of Federal Regulations (or successor regulations), is equal to 18 19 the sum obtained by adding— 20 (1) the adjusted Class I differential specified in 21 section 1000.52 of that title (or successor regula-22 tions); 23 (2) the adjustment to Class I prices specified in 24 sections 1005.51(b), 1006.51(b), and 1007.51(b) of 25 that title (or successor regulations); and

1	(3) the higher of—
2	(A) the advanced pricing factor computed
3	under section $1000.50(q)(1)$ of that title (or
4	successor regulations); and
5	(B) the advanced pricing factor computed
6	under section $1000.50(q)(2)$ of that title (or
7	successor regulations).
8	SEC. 3. MANDATORY REPORTING OF DAIRY PRODUCT
9	PROCESSING COSTS.
10	Section 273 of the Agricultural Marketing Act of
11	1946 (7 U.S.C. 1637b) is amended—
12	(1) in subsection $(b)(1)$ —
13	(A) in subparagraph (A)(ii), by striking
14	"and" at the end;
15	(B) in subparagraph (B), by striking the
16	period at the end and inserting a semicolon;
17	and
18	(C) by adding at the end the following:
19	"(C) for each manufacturer required to re-
20	port under subparagraph (A) for any product,
21	require that manufacturer to report cost and
22	yield information, as determined by the Sec-
23	retary, for all products processed in the same
24	facility or facilities; and

1	"(D) require any manufacturer of such
2	other dairy products as determined by the Sec-
3	retary to report cost and yield information in
4	the same manner as under subparagraph (C),
5	for the purposes of providing information for
6	the regulatory or administrative establishment
7	of pricing rules."; and
8	(2) in subsection (d), by adding at the end the
9	following:
10	"(3) Dairy product processing costs.—Not
11	later than 2 years after the date of enactment of
12	this paragraph, and every 2 years thereafter, the
13	Secretary shall publish a report containing the infor-
14	mation obtained under subparagraphs (C) and (D)
15	of subsection (b)(1).".
